At 6 pm, a formal concert dedicated to the 89th Anniversary of the Republic of Estonia will start in Tartu, at the Vanemuine Theater and Concert Hall, where President Toomas Hendrik Ilves will give the Independence Day speech. The concert will be followed by a reception by the President of the Republic and Mrs. Evelin Ilves. The anniversary celebrations will be broadcast by Estonian Television. FOR THE PRESS!
