"I remember a number of quite posh, yet minimalist Scandinavian designer homes, which completely enchanted our interior architects five years ago, when we first sat down with the panel of judges of the Home of the Year, launched by home magazine Kodukiri. Little by little, the number of homes built by people themselves and their families have found their way into the competition. I would describe 2011 as a Self-made Nice Nest," Evelin Ilves told.
